

Bringing Back Manufacturing

The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated how fragile local supply chains are and reinforced the importance of making things right here in Queensland. The government will now establish Manufacturing Skills Queensland to support industry participants, invest \$15.5 million in grants to focus on onshoring and reshoring of key industries and build a Manufacturing Hub, just south of Logan and Redlands to strengthen local capability.

Jobs For Locals

The \$51.8 billion Queensland Government Infrastructure guarantee provides industry with confidence to invest and sustain jobs across Queensland. The 4-year investment program is the largest in nearly a decade and will sustain activity and jobs in the State's construction sector for workers like the team from FireVac Services in Shailer Park. Add to this our continued implementation of security of payment reforms that will deliver:

- A simplified Project Bank Account framework, now called Trust Accounts,
- Greater prosecuting powers to the QBCC to investigate false statutory declarations,
- More ways for builders to recoup monies owed, including charges on land and payment withholding requests on financiers.
- Greater transparency of the certification process to increase consumer confidence,
- More effective regulatory powers for the boards of architects and engineers, improving confidence in the safety and quality of the built environment,



Updating local fire protection sector tradies on the infrastructure guarantee and our security of payment reforms implementation timetable.

- A statutory review into the role of property developers, including their workplace practices, in the construction industry.

Sports facilities for Springwood Road State School

To ensure local kids have access to quality facilities, we'll deliver an upgrade to the school's playing surface so that sport can be played safely. This will build on the long term success of the P&C's investment in sport and play areas.



More frontline service personnel

We will continue to bolster local services with 6190 extra teachers, 1139 extra teacher aides, 9475 healthcare workers, 2025 more police personnel and 357 extra firefighters.

Building a second M1

South of the Logan River work will get underway on the \$1.5 billion, 16 km stage one route of the Second M1 between Coomera and Nerang, which will support hundreds of local jobs. (I can confirm that the gazetted route doesn't impact Daisy Hill Forest.)



Better schools — new hall for Rochedale State High School

The very popular Rochedale State High will join with Springwood, Shailer Park and Victoria Point State High schools with new or refurbished halls, ensuring a strong pipeline of economic activity and local jobs to support the COVID-19 recovery effort.

Next stage of Daisy Hill Action Plan — more and better trails

Our extra \$2 million investment into the 2nd stage of the Daisy Hill Action Plan will deliver new and upgraded mountain bike trails, more disability and mobility access, improved trailheads and upgraded walking trails through the forest. 4 laning Beenleigh-Redland Bay Road

Currently it's a narrow, windy, dangerous road. It shouldn't be like that; and I'm proud to let you know, that it won't be for much longer. The upgrades between California Creek Rd and Mount Cotton Rd will include 2 lanes each way, a second bridge over California Creek, a pedestrian and cycle path, safety barriers and high friction surface treatments.

Progressing the Mount Cotton State School Master Plan



Work will continue to deliver on the Mount Cotton State School Master Plan by investing in new facilities for local families. Future stages of the Master Plan encroach on existing play space and a new school oval will be built to make way for future building upgrades. A full size school oval will see both the opportunity to return inter-school sport back to Mount Cotton and potential for more young athletes to emerge. The development will be supported with new amenities because local kids deserve the best.



Jobs for locals — fire station for Mount Cotton

A \$12.2 million fully operational, 24/7 fire station will be delivered by local tradies in 2021, significantly boosting the local economy and bringing more full time firefighters with off-road and bushfire fighting capacity to prepare for future growth in the region.



Better hospitals — Redland Hospital expansion and Australian first Satellite Hospital

In a national first, we'll use local tradies to build a new satellite hospital, tailored to the needs of our community. We will deliver better care, close to home and add to the major expansions of both Redland and Logan Hospital.

Better roads — delivering the M1 upgrade and Busway extension

A record investment in the M1 will continue under a \$5 billion plan to slash travel times and support more than 3600 jobs. The centrepiece of the plan is the \$1 billion M1 upgrade and Busway extension between Daisy Hill and Loganholme. The project will be progressively rolled from north to south, with work on the detailed designs that will see the full completion of the project to commence.
